



**Title: Archaeology Monitor**

**Reports to: Archaeologist – Sugar Cane Archaeology**

**Job Summary:**

The Archaeology Monitor works under the direction of the Sugar Cane Archaeology Archaeologist and assists Archaeological Field Supervisors, Crew Chiefs, and Permit Holders in carrying out archaeological field studies.

**Field Studies:**

- Assists in visual assessment of survey areas to identify archaeologically significant sites.
- Conducts shovel testing under the direction of field leads. Shovel testing involves digging test pits and soil screening to uncover archaeological or cultural heritage resources. Care and attention to detail are necessary to meet permit requirements. Mapping, flagging and other archaeological techniques may also be used as directed
- Can include forestry field work which includes hiking long distances and sometimes in steep terrain as well some projects will be on highways or development projects which will require using care in working around heavy machinery & proper PPE (hard hat, steel toed boots, high vis vest)
- Other related duties as required.

- RISC – archaeological inventory & CMT training for crew members an asset
- Ethnobotany experience/training an asset
- Valid Class 5 BC Driver’s license required
- S100 certification an asset
- Previous experience/training in archaeology monitoring an asset
- Forestry experience/training an asset
- Current Standard First Aid or OFA Level 1 First Aid certification an asset

**Working Conditions:**

- Non-standard hours of work (long hours and early start times may be necessary)
